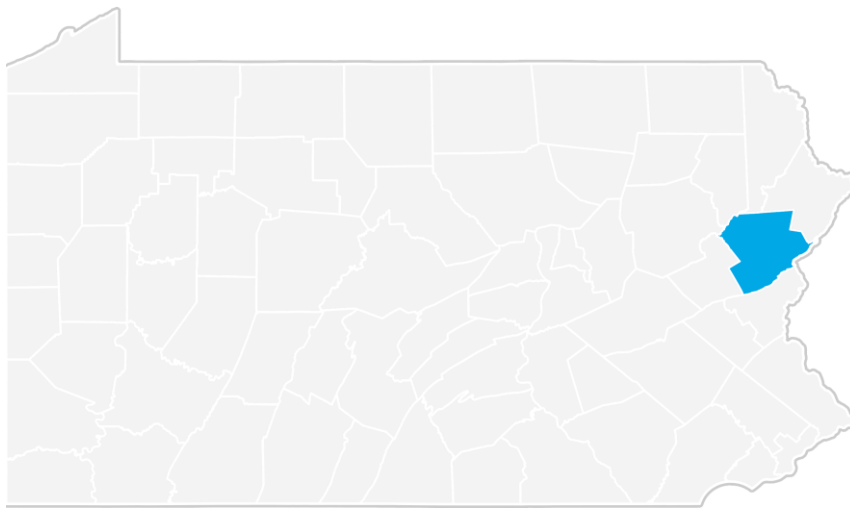

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Demographic Profile

The population in Monroe County, Pennsylvania was 167,306 per American Community Survey data for 2013-2017.

The region has a civilian labor force of 86,320 with a participation rate of 62.5%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Monroe County, Pennsylvania, 24.7% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 32.3% in the nation.

The median household income in Monroe County, Pennsylvania is \$61,430 and the median house value is \$167,200.

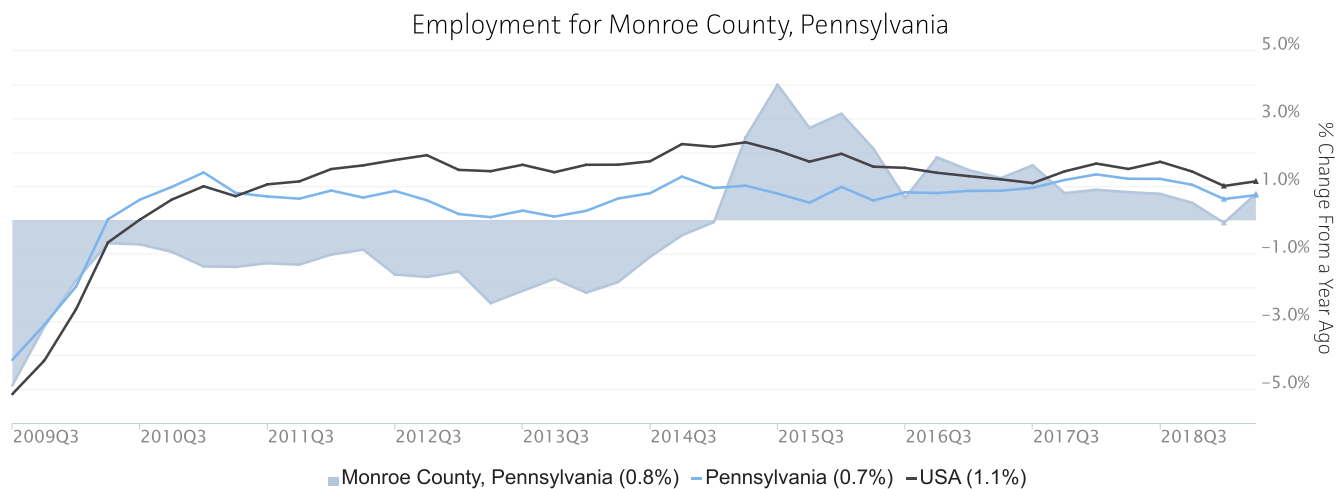

Employment Trends

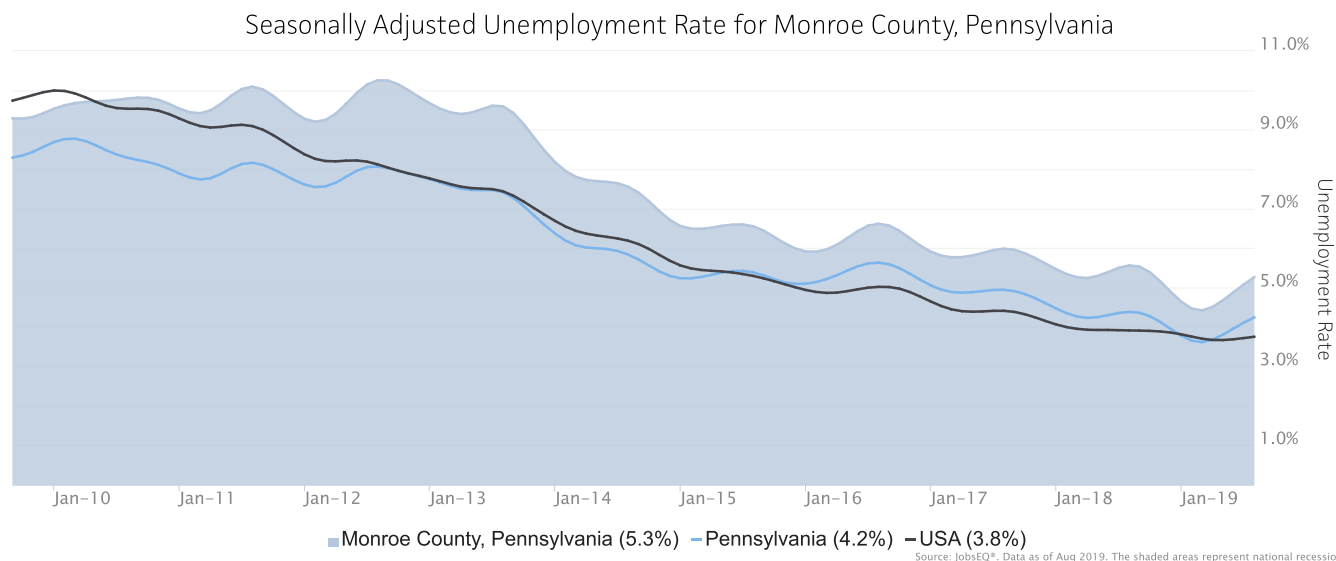
As of 2019Q2, total employment for Monroe County, Pennsylvania was 61,187 (based on a four-quarter moving average). Over the year ending 2019Q2, employment increased 0.8% in the region.



Employment data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2018Q4 with preliminary estimates updated to 2019Q2.

Unemployment Rate

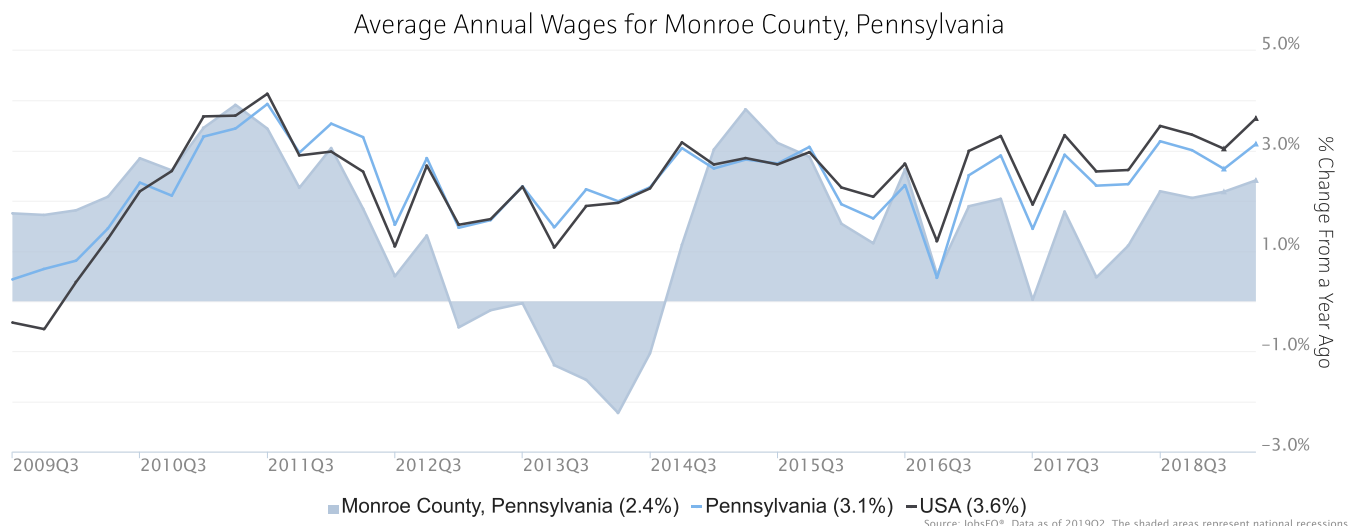
The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for Monroe County, Pennsylvania was 5.3% as of August 2019. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 3.8%. One year earlier, in August 2018, the unemployment rate in Monroe County, Pennsylvania was 5.6%.



Unemployment rate data are from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and updated through August 2019.

Wage Trends

The average worker in Monroe County, Pennsylvania earned annual wages of \$42,659 as of 2019Q2. Average annual wages per worker increased 2.4% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$57,025 in the nation as of 2019Q2.



Annual average wages per worker data are derived from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages, provided by the Bureau of Labor Statistics and imputed where necessary. Data are updated through 2018Q4 with preliminary estimates updated to 2019Q2.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 2.1% higher in Monroe County, Pennsylvania than the U.S. average.

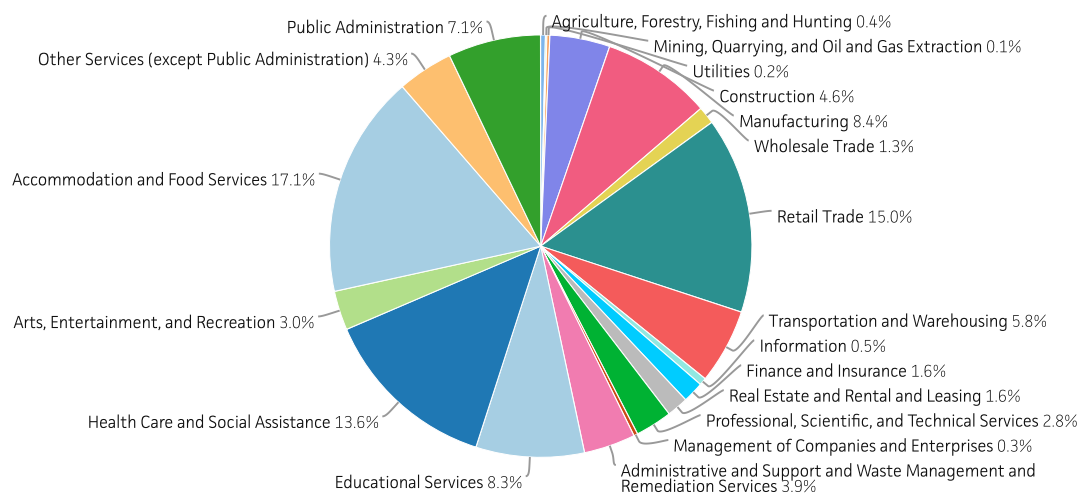

Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in Monroe County, Pennsylvania is Accommodation and Food Services, employing 10,436 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Retail Trade (9,184 workers) and Health Care and Social Assistance (8,317). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Accommodation and Food Services (LQ = 1.89), Public Administration (1.51), and Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (1.50).

Sectors in Monroe County, Pennsylvania with the highest average wages per worker are Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$131,542), Utilities (\$98,264), and Manufacturing (\$79,485). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 5 years are Accommodation and Food Services (+1,904 jobs), Health Care and Social Assistance (+1,150), and Transportation and Warehousing (+702).

Over the next 1 year, employment in Monroe County, Pennsylvania is projected to contract by 170 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Health Care and Social Assistance with a +1.2% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Health Care and Social Assistance (+100 jobs), Transportation and Warehousing (+6), and Construction (+3).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Monroe County, Pennsylvania is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 8,361 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Sales and Related Occupations (7,177 workers) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (7,130). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Life, Physical, and Social Science Occupations (LQ = 1.57), Building and Grounds Cleaning and Maintenance Occupations (1.52), and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (1.35).

Occupation groups in Monroe County, Pennsylvania with the highest average wages per worker are Management Occupations (\$99,700), Architecture and Engineering Occupations (\$81,300), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$73,900). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 1.9% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 8.0% among Farming, Fishing, and Forestry Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Monroe County, Pennsylvania is expected to be Healthcare Support Occupations with a +1.4% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (+23 jobs) and Personal Care and Service Occupations (+21). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (1,196 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (982).

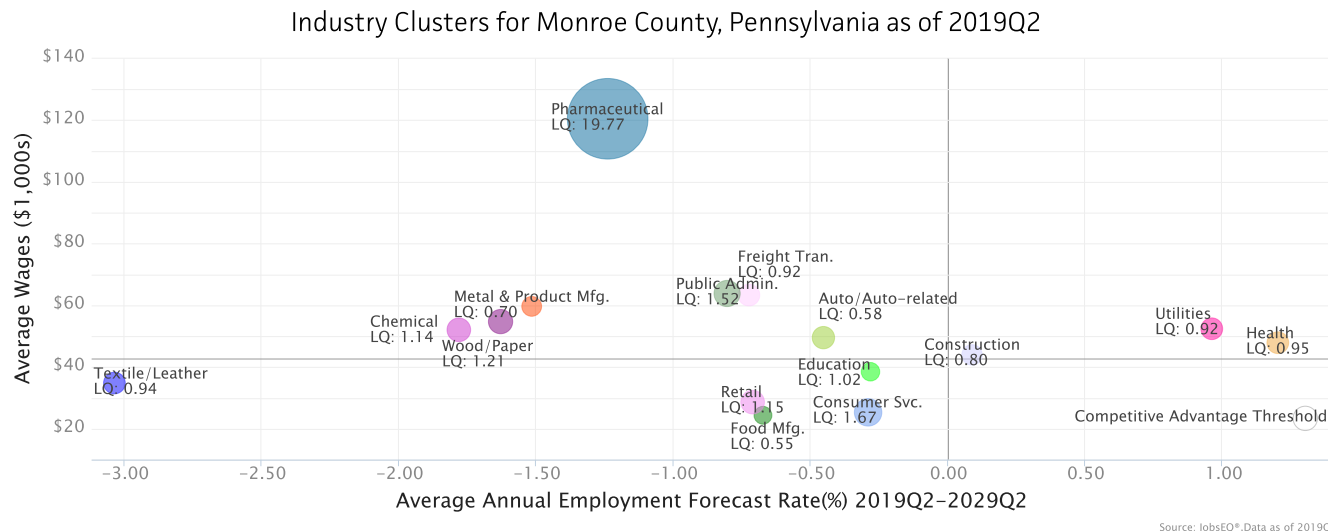

Industry Clusters

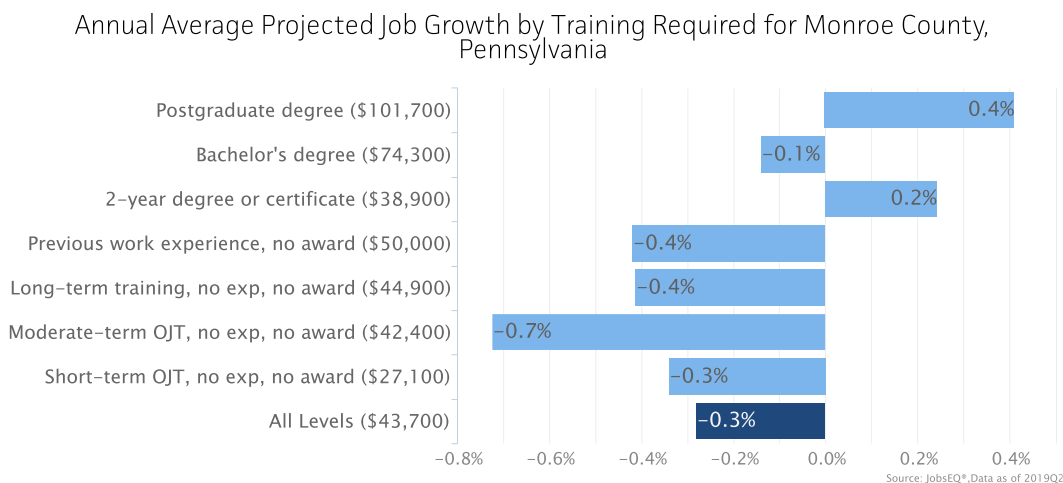
A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Monroe County, Pennsylvania with the highest relative concentration is Pharmaceutical with a location quotient of 19.77. This cluster employs 2,280 workers in the region with an average wage of \$120,491. Employment in the Pharmaceutical cluster is projected to contract in the region about 1.2% per year over the next ten years.

Education Levels

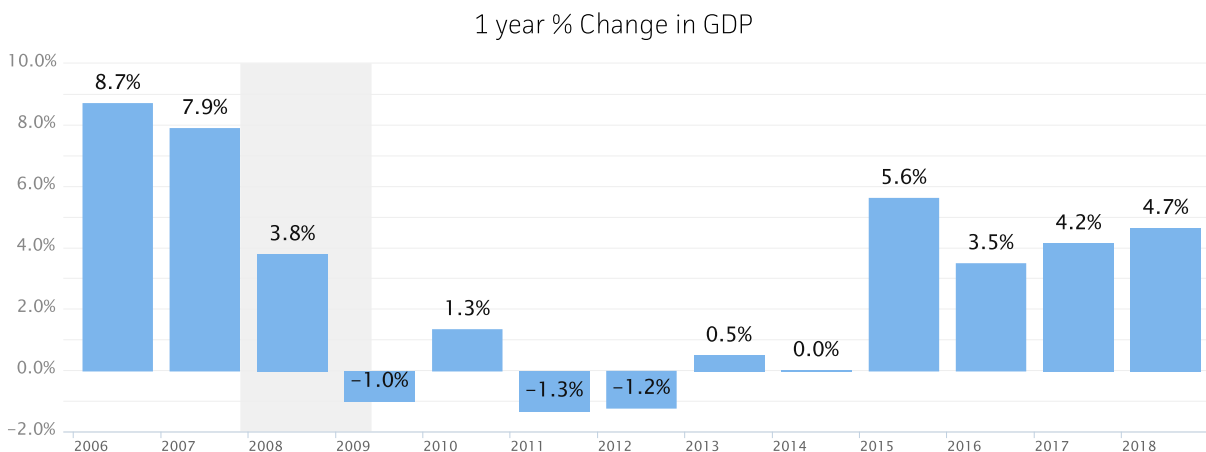
Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Monroe County, Pennsylvania is projected to contract 0.3% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.4% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to contract 0.1% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.2% per year.



Employment by occupation data are estimates as of 2019Q2. Education levels of occupations are based on BLS assignments. Forecast employment growth uses national projections from the Bureau of Labor Statistics adapted for regional growth patterns.

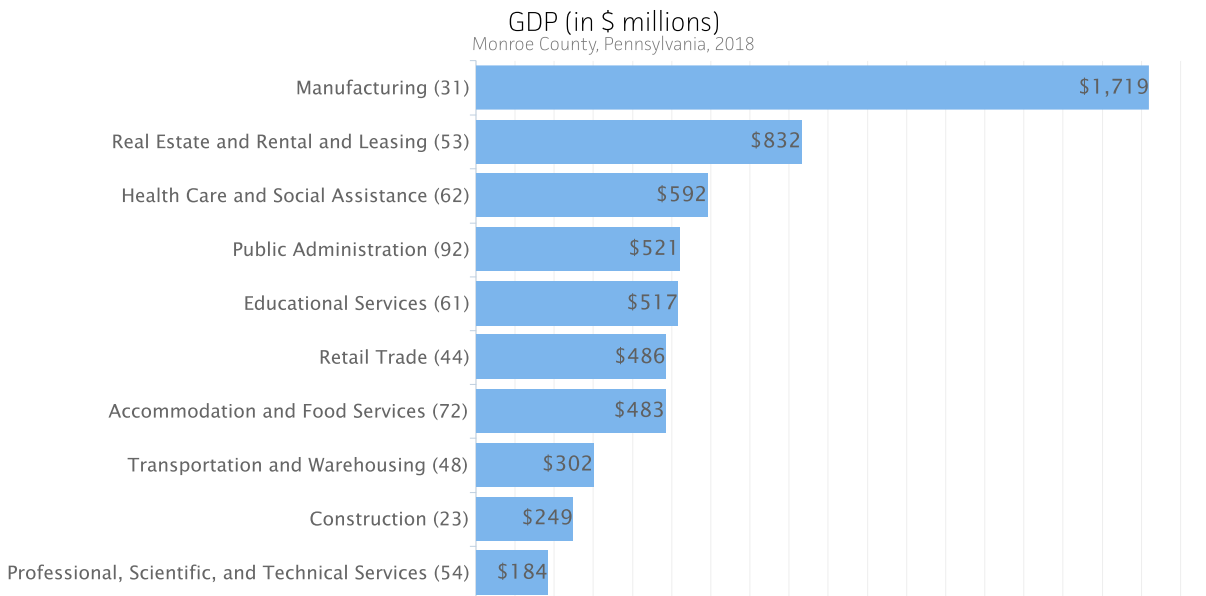
Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2018, nominal GDP in Monroe County, Pennsylvania expanded 4.7%. This follows growth of 4.2% in 2017. As of 2018, total GDP in Monroe County, Pennsylvania was \$6,772,133,000.



Gross Domestic Product data are provided by the Bureau of Economic Analysis, imputed by Chmura where necessary, updated through 2018.

Of the sectors in Monroe County, Pennsylvania, Manufacturing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2018, \$1,719,331,000. The next-largest contributions came from Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (\$832,311,000); Health Care and Social Assistance (\$591,866,000); and Public Administration (\$520,941,000).

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a *competitive advantage* in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the “all industry” level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the “sector,” which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 820 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 23 major groups, 96 minor groups, and 449 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.

About This Report

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
