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Demographic Profile

The population in Monroe County, Pennsylvania was 168,824 per American Community Survey data for 2016-2020.

The region has a civilian labor force of 85,516 with a participation rate of 61.0%. Of individuals 25 to 64 in Monroe County, Pennsylvania, 26.1% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 34.3% in the nation.

The median household income in Monroe County, Pennsylvania is \$68,734 and the median house value is \$173,800.



Employment Trends



Unemployment Rate


The unemployment rate for Monroe County, Pennsylvania was 6.1% as of July 2022. The regional unemployment rate was higher than the national rate of 3.8%. One year earlier, in July 2021, the unemployment rate in Monroe County, Pennsylvania was 8.2%.

Wage Trends

The average worker in Monroe County, Pennsylvania earned annual wages of \$49,809 as of 2022Q1. Average annual wages per worker increased 2.8% in the region over the preceding four quarters. For comparison purposes, annual average wages were \$66,637 in the nation as of 2022Q1.

Cost of Living Index

The Cost of Living Index estimates the relative price levels for consumer goods and services. When applied to wages and salaries, the result is a measure of relative purchasing power. The cost of living is 0.9% higher in Monroe County, Pennsylvania than the U.S. average.





Industry Snapshot

The largest sector in Monroe County, Pennsylvania is Accommodation and Food Services, employing 9,106 workers. The next-largest sectors in the region are Retail Trade (8,944 workers) and Health Care and Social Assistance (7,919). High location quotients (LQs) indicate sectors in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The sectors with the largest LQs in the region are Accommodation and Food Services (LQ = 1.88), Public Administration (1.53), and Retail Trade (1.47).

Sectors in Monroe County, Pennsylvania with the highest average wages per worker are Management of Companies and Enterprises (\$150,433), Utilities (\$109,128), and Manufacturing (\$86,492). Regional sectors with the best job growth (or most moderate job losses) over the last 5 years are Transportation and Warehousing (+851 jobs), Manufacturing (+214), and Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services (+168).

Over the next 1 year, employment in Monroe County, Pennsylvania is projected to expand by 17 jobs. The fastest growing sector in the region is expected to be Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation with a +2.3% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Accommodation and Food Services (+129 jobs), Health Care and Social Assistance (+56), and Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (+35).

Occupation Snapshot

The largest major occupation group in Monroe County, Pennsylvania is Office and Administrative Support Occupations, employing 6,683 workers. The next-largest occupation groups in the region are Sales and Related Occupations (6,356 workers) and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (5,994). High location quotients (LQs) indicate occupation groups in which a region has high concentrations of employment compared to the national average. The major groups with the largest LQs in the region are Life, Physical, and Social Science Occupations (LQ = 1.78), Building and Grounds Cleaning and Maintenance Occupations (1.44), and Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (1.32).

Occupation groups in Monroe County, Pennsylvania with the highest average wages per worker are Management Occupations (\$102,600), Computer and Mathematical Occupations (\$82,300), and Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations (\$82,100). The unemployment rate in the region varied among the major groups from 2.1% among Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations to 12.0% among Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations.

Over the next 1 year, the fastest growing occupation group in Monroe County, Pennsylvania is expected to be Personal Care and Service Occupations with a +1.7% year-over-year rate of growth. The strongest forecast by number of jobs over this period is expected for Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (+79 jobs) and Personal Care and Service Occupations (+31). Over the same period, the highest separation demand (occupation demand due to retirements and workers moving from one occupation to another) is expected in Food Preparation and Serving Related Occupations (1,100 jobs) and Sales and Related Occupations (837).





Industry Clusters

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. The industry cluster in Monroe County, Pennsylvania with the highest relative concentration is Pharmaceutical with a location quotient of 20.84. This cluster employs 2,621 workers in the region with an average wage of \$130,805. Employment in the Pharmaceutical cluster is projected to contract in the region about 0.4% per year over the next ten years.





Education Levels

Expected growth rates for occupations vary by the education and training required. While all employment in Monroe County, Pennsylvania is projected to grow 0.0% over the next ten years, occupations typically requiring a postgraduate degree are expected to grow 0.2% per year, those requiring a bachelor's degree are forecast to grow 0.2% per year, and occupations typically needing a 2-year degree or certificate are expected to grow 0.1% per year.


Annual Average Projected Job Growth by Training Required

Gross Domestic Product


Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is the total value of goods and services produced by a region. In 2021, nominal GDP in Monroe County, Pennsylvania expanded 8.3%. This follows a contraction of 3.7% in 2020. As of 2021, total GDP in Monroe County, Pennsylvania was \$7,251,629,000.



1 year % Change in GDP



Of the sectors in Monroe County, Pennsylvania, Manufacturing contributed the largest portion of GDP in 2021, \$2,051,195,000 The next-largest contributions came from Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (\$681,146,000); Health Care and Social Assistance (\$620,954,000); and Retail Trade (\$585,905,000).

FAQ

What is a location quotient?

A location quotient (LQ) is a measurement of concentration in comparison to the nation. An LQ of 1.00 indicates a region has the same concentration of an industry (or occupation) as the nation. An LQ of 2.00 would mean the region has twice the expected employment compared to the nation and an LQ of 0.50 would mean the region has half the expected employment in comparison to the nation.

What is separation demand?

Separation demand is the number of jobs required due to separations—labor force exits (including retirements) and turnover resulting from workers moving from one occupation into another. Note that separation demand does not include all turnover—it does not include when workers stay in the same occupation but switch employers. The total projected demand for an occupation is the sum of the separation demand and the growth demand (which is the increase or decrease of jobs in an occupation expected due to expansion or contraction of the overall number of jobs in that occupation).

What is a cluster?

A cluster is a geographic concentration of interrelated industries or occupations. If a regional cluster has a location quotient of 1.25 or greater, the region is considered to possess a competitive advantage in that cluster.

What is the difference between industry wages and occupation wages?

Industry wages and occupation wages are estimated via separate data sets, often the time periods being reported do not align, and wages are defined slightly differently in the two systems (for example, certain bonuses are included in the industry wages but not the occupation wages). It is therefore common that estimates of the average industry wages and average occupation wages in a region do not match exactly.

What is NAICS?

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is used to classify business establishments according to the type of economic activity. The NAICS Code comprises six levels, from the "all industry" level to the 6-digit level. The first two digits define the top level category, known as the "sector," which is the level examined in this report.

What is SOC?

The Standard Occupational Classification system (SOC) is used to classify workers into occupational categories. All workers are classified into one of over 804 occupations according to their occupational definition. To facilitate classification, occupations are combined to form 22 major groups, 95 minor groups, and 452 occupation groups. Each occupation group includes detailed occupations requiring similar job duties, skills, education, or experience.
